I have always loved the words of Paul to the Thessalonians 1 verses 1to 4.

Patience is the restraint which keeps us all grounded in love towards others, one of the fruits of the Spirit. We learn from Romans 15 verses 4&5 "Now may the God of patience and comfort for all whom I love grant you to be like minded towards one another, according to Christ Jesus"

One of my favourite poets Helen Steiner Rice has a poem entitled "Time is a Gift from God" in which the last four lines say;

But teach us to take time for praying, and to find time for listening to You,

So each day is spent well and wisely, doing what you most want us to do.

So I pray for all who are reading this, what I pray for (patiently every day) for all whom I know, "that you may with one mind and one mouth glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ" Romans 15 v6.

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
