FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Listening to (the Word of) God.

Follow The Spirit

In June, in our lectionary, we heard the story about Elijah hearing the voice of God – in the “sheer silence”. I noticed in that story, that Elijah listened, he was not reading! There is a quality of hearing and listening which is possible in silence, when God speaks with us. That is a very different experience than reading words off a page, and this summer, our PIP student Brent is offering the opportunity to do just that – listen – to the Reading of the Gospels.

At the writing of this article, there have been two “Reading the Gospels” sessions and the experience of those who have attended has, from what I’ve *heard* (see what I did there??), has been profound. They are noticing things they do not notice on Sunday mornings when:

- 1) we only hear a small segment of the Gospel, not the reading in its context.
- 2) we have print in front of us and our minds are occupied with reading as we follow along on the printed page.

As a supervisor, students always challenge my assumptions, and one of my challenges by Brent this year have been the challenge of weighing carefully the listening vs reading aspect of our worship. As an opera professional, Brent brings unique and delightful gifts of understanding about the power of hearing, and the power of singing. As an engineer, I am quite committed to seeing things written down.

I’ve also heard from many parishioners from both sides of this debate:

- some say why do we need all this paper; we should be listening.
- Others say they need the print because they have difficulty hearing, or they understand better if they can read along.



This summer I encourage you to try both ways. Read along sometimes. Close your eyes, and just listen sometimes. And give us your feedback on which way has been most impactful for you.



If you can make it, get in touch with Brent to listen to the Gospels being read, or join us for Compline services on Thursday evenings at St Margaret's Chapel. Have a lovely summer, stay safe, and keep your eyes, ears and heart open to hear what God may be saying to you – in the wind through the trees, in the sound of water, in the sheer silence.



The motion to approve the application to proceed with one CRA number for the Anglican Parish of the Bruce Peninsula was approved at the Special Vestry Meeting held on June 7th. Your Warden Jim Blight is now in discussions with the Diocese on process.

ADMINISTRATOR FOR OUR AVGEN PROGRAM

Helen Wheeler has been looking after the program for us for several years, but with her already busy schedule it is time to pass it on to someone else.

This volunteer position requires approximately 4 or 5 hours a month, and involves:

- making sure each congregation has a supply of personal order forms
- Collecting the completed forms from each congregation, usually the last Sunday of the month.
- Entering individual order forms on a master computerized form.
- Balancing bank deposit to order form.
- Deposit funds and forwarding monies to Avgen, through bank transfer.
- When cards received, balancing to master order placed.
- Sorting cards from orders received to individuals.
- Delivering cards to representative from each church for distribution to individuals.
- Reporting total earnings for each congregation in our annual report.

Reflection Gods Love of the Holy Land

Throughout the Bible we witness God's unwavering love and commitment towards Israel. From the very beginning God chose Israel as His people. Like a devoted parent this love is not based on their actions or their mistakes but is a testament to a parent's love, unwavering. That doesn't mean God hasn't been angry with his chosen people, just that like any parent sometimes angry; and sometimes patient.

In Deuteronomy 7:6 For you are a 'holy people to the Lord your God; the Lord your God has chosen you to be a people for Himself, a special treasure above all the peoples on the face of the earth.

If we examine the phrase 'light to the nations' in the Bible it is most prominently found in Isaiah 49:6, where God states, 'Indeed He says, "it is too small a thing that you should be my Servant. To raise up the tribes of Jacob, and to restore the preserved ones of Israel; I will also give You as a light to the Gentiles, That You should be My salvation to the ends of the earth." The Servant fulfills the call of Abraham and the nation of Israel to be a blessing to other nations. This verse is part of a larger prophecy about the servant of the Lord, Jesus, who would bring salvation to both Israel and the Gentiles after his death and resurrection, the great commission of global evangelism is carried on by His apostles (Acts 13:47; 26:23 and those who exceed them to the end of the age (Matt. 28:18-20) This verse emphasized the inclusive and universal nature of God's love for all people, who believe.

In essence, God's love for Israel is a complex and multifaceted relationship, marked by both divine grace and human failings, but ultimately characterized by unwavering love, faithfulness, and a promise of future restoration.

In The Holy Land of Today:

The devastation of war in the Holy Land has nearly obliterated the landscape leaving un-imageable scars on both the land and its people.

I would like to quote Dr. Lily Yen's statement in closing," I am just sad for everyone In God's beloved vineyard. Without the devastation of



wars, it can be a land flowing with milk and honey. But now so many endure so much unthinkable suffering".

I too am saddened for the destruction of the Holy Land and the endless suffering of all involved. I have no answers; certainly, no solutions to stop the destruction.

I can only offer my prayers to God and find a way to support the humanitarian appeals.

And I have to wonder for all the plans God has for his chosen people and through them the Gentiles does God have a broken heart!


